In August, the Obama Administration threatened a military attack on Syria. After a flood of public opposition and international pressure, the attack was delayed. The threat remains. Come hear from Syrian American keynote speaker, Dr. Matar Matar, and join a community discussion on how to build a movement to stop a war on Syria.



Dr. Matar Matar is from Syria. He came to the United States in 2009, and is a doctor working in clinical research in the Endocrinology field in Chicago. Matar is a member of the Syrian American Forum, which advocates Syrian National Reconciliation and Unity through dialogue, and rejects violence and foreign intervention. Matar is very active in most of the hands off Syria protests alongside other anti-war groups, where he has spoken out against the US military intervention on Syria and against arming the Syrian rebels. Known for his slogan, "Long Live Syria." his main concern is the future identity and unity of Syria.
